#### **Depression and Anxiety in Seniors**

- Approximately 20% of adults 55+ experience a mental health condition<sup>1</sup>
- Impairments to physical, mental or social functioning, reduced quality of life
- Complicates ability to function and conduct self-care
- Increased use of hospital services
- Increased risk for nursing facility care resulting in loss of independence<sup>2</sup>



## Caregivers Face Challenges, Too

- Constant demands, often with no support
- Often have own chronic conditions
- Between 40-70% of caregivers experience depression and/or anxiety<sup>3</sup>
- Rates higher for caregivers of persons with dementia and/or cognitive impairments<sup>4</sup>



## **Insights Behavioral Health Program**


- In-home services provided in English, Spanish, Korean and Vietnamese
- Addresses mild-to-moderate depression, anxiety, grief, bereavement, interpersonal conflicts and stress
- Available at no cost to participants

#### **Medication Safety Issues**

- Up to 48% of community dwelling elders have medication related problems.<sup>5</sup>
- At least 25% of all medication related accidents and health problems are preventable.<sup>6</sup>
- 1 in 6 hospital admissions of older adults is because of an adverse drug event. For persons older than 75 years, 1 in 3 hospital admissions are because of an adverse drug event.<sup>7</sup>
- Annual cost of drug related illness and death exceeds \$170 billion.<sup>8</sup>
- There are few community-based comprehensive medication services available to older adults.
