Philosophy

- We celebrate the diversity of our older adult population.
- We seek to achieve equity in access to services and support across the City, prioritizing underserved populations to reduce disparities in social and health outcomes.
- We seek to empower active and engaged older adults to help steer the course of future services and programs.



Data

- 25% (119,000) adults over age 50 live in Long Beach
- 9% (43,000) are 65 years or older
- 47% live alone
- 13% live below poverty line (\$11,770 for one person household)
- 40% have a disability
- 25% have less than a high school education
- 24% speak English "less than very well"





African American 10%



Current Services Provided by the City

- Information and Referral Line (1,200 calls per month)
- Senior Links Program (Public Health Nurse)
- Activities (e.g., exercise, games, arts & crafts, educational programs, health screenings and many others)
- Fall Risk Assessment and Prevention Education Classes
- Multi-Service Center to support linkages for Homeless

Funding

City

- \$850,000 for Parks and Recreation Services (PRM)
- \$100,000 for Senior Links (HHS)

County

 Funding from State to LA County to provide services across the County.

Multiple studies provide insight into the core needs of our Older Adults in Long Beach



Previous Studies

- Long Beach Strategic Plan for Older Adults (June 2005)
 - Over 500 participants
- Determining Needs in the Creation of a Long Beach Village for Older Adults (September 2012)
 - Over 280 participants
- St. Mary Medical Center Community Benefit Reports (2012-2015)
 - Over **300** participants
- Older Adults Case Management Summit (October 2015)
 - Over 70 participants



Identified Service Need Areas

Key service need areas have remained consistent across the

studies:

- Safety
- Transportation
- Housing
- Health
- Quality of Life

Need for Coordination

VISION

A coordinated health and social service continuum of care that effectively links older adults to the care they need, when they need it, to support quality of life.



Recommendation: Implement a Coordinated System of Services

- Develop an Older Adult Task Force
- Establish a One-Stop Adult Resource Network or an Office of Aging
- Enhance Community Engagement



Next Steps

- Develop a Comprehensive Resources Guide for the City (including on-line accessibility)
- Convene a Consortium of Stakeholders
- Open an Office of Aging
- Continuum to seek funding to support services in the our City
