	Applying and removing bandages, dressings, orthopedic appliances, removing casts, splints, and other internal devices
	Performing electrocardiogram
	Administering medications orally, sublingually, topically, intranasally, vaginally, rectally, or by providing a single dose to a patient for immediate self-administration
	Ten (10) clock hours of training in administering injections and satisfactory performance by the trainee of at least ten (10) each of intramuscular, subcutaneous, and intradermal injections
	Ten (10) clock hours of training in venipuncture and skin puncture for the purpose of withdrawing blood, and satisfactory performance by the trainee of at least ten (10) each of venipunctures and skin punctures
	For those only administering medication by inhalation, ten (10) clock hours of training in administering medication by inhalation

Hearing screening: performing audiometric testing, not requiring interpretation by the medical assistant to obtain test results. See Audiometric Screening Training Videos Parts 1–3 (approx. 75 minutes).

Vision screening: performing visual field testing, simple or automated ophthalmic testing, not requiring interpretation by the medical assistant to obtain test results. See Vision Screening Training Video (approx. 31 minutes).

Dental services: performing oral and fluoride screenings, establish dental home, referral to a dentist at least annually, and applying fluoride varnish. See Fluoride Varnish PowerPoint (approx. 20 minutes).
