## **METHODOLOGY**

An online survey of 1,000 Seniors Ages 65+ in California, and an oversample of up to 500 Hispanic Seniors Ages 65+ in California

## **CONTENT QUESTIONS**

1. In which of the following environments would you be comfortable living as you age?

## **Methodological Notes:**

The SCAN Survey was conducted by Wakefield Research (<a href="www.wakefieldresearch.com">www.wakefieldresearch.com</a>) among 1,000 Seniors Ages 65+ in California, and an oversample of up to 500 Hispanic Seniors Ages 65+ in California, between July 20 and July 30, 2018, using an email invitation and an online survey.

Results of any sample are subject to sampling variation. The magnitude of the variation is measurable and is affected by the number of interviews and the level of the percentages expressing the results. For the interviews conducted in this particular study, the chances are 95 in 100 that a survey result does not vary, plus or minus, by more than 4.4 percentage points for the Hispanic sample and 3.1 percentage points for the representative sample, from the result that would be obtained if interviews had been conducted with all persons in the universe represented by the sample.
